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From the Director

When I first sat down to plan this concert I started by listening to random choral pieces without a specific theme in mind. I'd find a piece I loved and that spoke to me in some way and I would jot down the title and the composer's/arranger's name until I had a nice long list of pieces I thought would be a good fit for the choir and that you, our audience, would enjoy.

After going through these selections it turns out there was nothing random about the list I'd compiled. Perhaps it was my subconscious reaction to the craziness in this world at the moment but these pieces I had been drawn to spoke of love, acceptance, community, belonging, personal responsibility to enact change and in some cases, shined a light on some real issues plaguing our society.

The translation of our opening piece "Ngothando" is literally "Through love only, we will conquer everything!"

More than this idea of love and its infinite power to change the world for the better was a call to

action to each one of us to be the source of that love and light. The answer to the question "where does the light begin?" is simple. WE are where the light begins!

Tonight's program includes songs that I hope will bring comfort: "Found/Tonight", "Does the World Say" and "Bridge Over Troubled Water" not only bring much needed comfort, but encourage us to reach out and "don't let go"....

Want a call to action? "United in Purpose" and "Caravan of Love" might just be the inspiration we all need!

Most pieces have an uplifting message. "I Dream A World" and "A Million Dreams" though very different in style, conjure up visions of a world where everyone is free and the (admittedly quirky) selection "Colorful" lists the many ways in which we can be free to be ourselves!

I hope you enjoy tonight's performance as much as we enjoyed working on it. Music is a powerful way to communicate.

It's not just notes and rhythms....it's not just words....of course those things are the foundation, but equally important is how music makes you feel whether you're the performer or the audience member. I hope tonight you feel the love, the hope and the community we're trying to build.

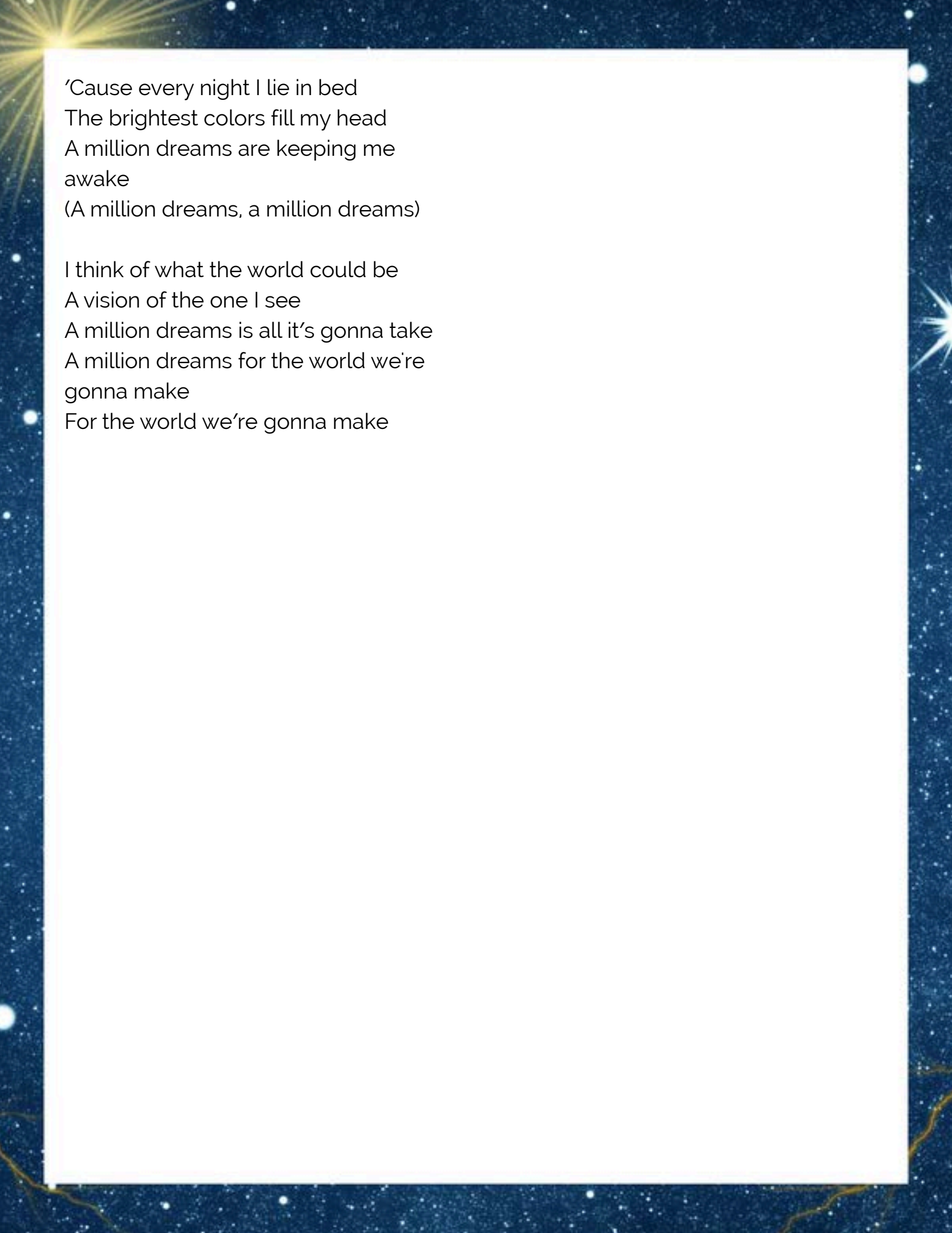
Special things I compile
